



What to bring to camp?

Uniform

All participants are expected to wear the full BSA field uniform which includes scout shirt, pants/shorts, belt, and socks. Hat and neckerchiefs will be given to the participant on arrival to the course.

Medical Forms

A, B, and C forms will be needed. Please notify Course Director of any allergies to medications or foods prior to course.

Gear

After your registration is accepted, each participant will receive a list of needed items to bring. Some items on the list include: a tent, sleeping bag, pillow, rain gear, extra shoes, flashlight, mess kit, personal gear, water bottle. Scouts from the same Troop will not be placed in the same patrol and each will need their own tent for the week.

What is NYLT?

NYLT is an action packed weeklong advanced leadership course for Boy Scouts and Venture Scouts. It is the Gold standard when it comes to leadership courses.

The participants will camp, cook, and learn in a Patrol throughout the weeklong course. Each day of NYLT is structured to represent a week in an Ideal Troop. The Patrol method structure will help the scout learn and apply the leadership objectives of the course. Leadership sessions are taught by Scout alumni and supported by the SPL and adult leaders. Outdoor games, activities, and mnemonics (memory aides) reinforce leadership discussions and help the Scout learn lifelong leadership skills.

Who Can Attend NYLT?

NYLT is for Scouts at least age 13 and Ventures who are 14 years of age, or 13 and have completed the 8th grade, currently serving in a leadership position or wish to be in a leadership position in their Troop. Scouts must be of First Class rank or higher. All scouts should have experience camping, cooking, and hiking as well as the maturity to handle working with others in this fast paced leadership camp.
